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Tie-breakers: Factors Considered

- If more than one pupil with the same PSLE score is vying for the last available place in a school, priority will be based on:
- 1. Citizenship
- 2. School choice order
- Computerised balloting will happen when all the other tiebreaking conditions are the same.



Affiliation



- Eligible affiliated students will be accorded affiliation priority for admission to the affiliated secondary school, if the student:
 - Meets the affiliate minimum PSLE score requirement (i.e. the AMR); and
 - Indicates the affiliated secondary school as his/her <u>first choice</u> in S1 Posting.
- If the affiliated student meets the AMR but does <u>not</u> indicate the affiliated secondary school as his/her first choice, the student will <u>not</u> be considered for affiliation priority.



Affiliation

- 20% of the Sec 1 places in each course (i.e. Express/ N(A)/N(T)) - reserved for students with no affiliation priority.
- >Eligible affiliates will be posted based on their PSLE score until 80% of places are filled.
- >The remaining eligible affiliates will be considered together with other students without affiliation priority, based on PSLE scores.
- > If they are not posted to this school, they will be considered for their next choice school.
